### Odessa College Odessa, Texas

Odessa College in Odessa, Texas holds the honor of being "the winningest junior college in the United States." Over the past 58 years, while winning 45 national championship titles, student-athletes attending Odessa College have achieved not only success in the athletic arena but in the classroom as well.

The goal of uniting academic and athletic accomplishment has been a focus of OC since it opened its doors to 185 students in 1946. Today almost 5,000 students are enrolled in university-parallel and occupational/technical credit courses. The campus now spreads over 80 acres, encompassing more than 25 buildings including the \$7 million Sports Center with more than 110,000 square feet of floor space that houses athletics, physical education and community recreation programs.

A few miles outside of Odessa, which is center to the oil-rich Permian Basin of West Texas, lies the college's Rodeo and Agriculture Graham Center, a 120-acre equine facility and ranch that supports OC's nationally-recognized rodeo program.

OC's tradition of winning continues under the leadership of John Wilfert, director of intercollegiate athletics; Dr. Vance Gipson, president; and Dr. Bill Thalmann, vice-president of student services.

"We are very fortunate to have an administration that cares about the student-athletes and wants them to succeed both academically and athletically," said Wilfert. "Our administration is a vital part of the athletic department's success. Athletics is more than just winning and losing. We believe in teaching life-long learning skills that these students can take with them the rest of their lives."

Wilfert is supported in that philosophy by Gipson who noted, "Odessa College has an outstanding athletic tradition of which we are very proud. The success that we have enjoyed in national competition, however, is surpassed by our pride in the academic accomplishments of our student-athletes. We're especially pleased to note that approximately 50 percent of OC's student-athletes earned a 3.0 GPA or better this last semester. We believe that our coaches and athletic staff have truly achieved the appropriate balance of academics and athletics."

To date, more than 1,000 student-athletes at OC have received National Junior College All-American honors. The athletic department also has had numerous Academic All-Americans.

"The future of Odessa College athletics looks to continue into the next decade with champions both on the playing field and in the classroom," said Wilfert. "Student-athletes who come through our program will always be winners."
